PUBLIC INVOLVEMENT MEETING

RECONSTRUCTION OF

STAUDE ROAD BRIDGES AND APPROACHES JEFFERSON COUNTY

February 3, 2026 6:30 p.m. to 7:30 p.m.

The reconstruction of the Staude Road bridge over Duck Creek will be discussed at a public involvement meeting scheduled by the Town of Sullivan, Wisconsin.

The meeting will be held as part of the Town Board meeting on Thursday, February 3rd, 2026, from 6:30 p.m. to 7:30 p.m. at the Town of Sullivan Town Hall, N3866 West Street (Rome) (behind St. Lukes Church) Sullivan, WI 53178. Residents and heavy route users are encouraged to attend.

The Town of Sullivan will replace the bridge on Staude Road over Duck Creek (approximately 0.9 miles west of the intersection with CTH P). The bridges and approaches will be reconstructed. Work included will be existing bridge removal, new bridge construction, grading, riprap, dredging, asphalt pavement, base aggregate dense, erosion control, tree clearing, and minor landscaping. No right-of-way acquisition is anticipated.

This Staude Road bridge will be closed to traffic for approximately 5 months during construction in 2027. Access will be maintained to all properties for homeowners and emergency services.

The new bridge and approaches will have 11-foot-wide travel lanes and 3-foot-wide shoulders to match the proposed 24-foot clear width structure. The approaches will taper down to match the existing 11-foot-wide travel lanes and 1-foot-wide gravel shoulders.

The purpose of the meeting is to discuss the preliminary plans and schedule for the roadway and bridge construction project and gather public input. Any comments that may be of interest to the design team are welcome.

The meeting will be organized in an open-house format and interested persons are invited to attend at their convenience. There will be a presentation at the onset to provide an overview of the projects followed by questions. Representatives from the Town of Sullivan and Ayres Associates will be available to discuss the design details, address comments, and answer questions. Displays showing some of the proposed project work will be available for viewing.

Persons with a concern or knowledge about the floodplain, historic buildings and structures, public lands, and archaeological sites are encouraged to attend this meeting or provide comments to the Town of Sullivan.
